

A new Continuing Medical Education (CME) course, [Diagnosis and Management of Chronic Fatigue Syndrome \(CFS\)](#), has been made available by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Health care providers make take this course for CME credit; others, including the public, are welcome to view the course without credit.

Description: The Diagnosis and Management of Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (CFS) course is a web-based training course designed to teach clinicians and other healthcare professionals about the background, epidemiology, diagnosis, and management of CFS. Lesson 1 provides an overview and definition of CFS. Lesson 2 teaches about making a diagnosis of CFS. Lesson 3 reviews possible triggers or causes of CFS and Lesson 4 gives an overview of management strategies. Lesson 5 discusses the impact of CFS. After the lessons, two clinical case studies will be presented.
